

WHAT IS CO2 GOOD FOR?

In 1956 the Crosman Corporation released their .22-caliber model 150 single shot pistol. It used a 12-gram CO2 cartridge for power that went on to become the poster child for CO2 guns.



The 12-gram CO2 cartridge has been a mainstay of airguns since 1956.

Speaking of history, the use of CO2 in guns dates back to the last half of the 19th century. In the early 1870s Paul Giffard produced a series of CO2-powered rifles and pistols. Those guns were all filled by the bulk-fill process.

CO2 guns had existed for many years before this. Crosman had a model 117 repeating rifle that was used as a carnival gun in the 1930s. Later it turned into the model 118 after the 12-gram cartridge was established. And Crosman had many bulk-fill CO2 guns before the model 150 hit the street.

The Benjamin Air Rifle Company even had CO2 guns that used cartridges a full decade before the

Crosman 150. They used smaller 8-gram cartridges that were famous for their use in seltzer bottles. They gave fewer shots than the 12-gram cartridges and soon became a thing of history.

Repeaters

One thing CO2 did was give airgunners an alternative to pumping or cocking their guns. It made repeating airguns possible. Until the modern precharged pneumatic (PCP) rifle was created by Daystate in 1980, CO2 was the only way to get a modern airgun to repeat. I say a modern airgun because PCPs are the very first type of airgun powerplant. There was a repeating precharged air rifle called the Girardoni in 1780. But until 1980 PCPs were only an expensive antique.

Carbon dioxide gas made repeating guns easy to build. In fact, making repeating guns possible is perhaps the greatest contribution CO2 has made to the world of airguns. Because CO2 is pressurized to a stable pressure as long as liquid CO2 remains and because the 12-gram cartridge is small, CO2 is a convenient power source for repeaters—especially repeating handguns

Replicas

The Umarex Corporation has made a name for making realistic-looking and functioning replica airguns. Since carbon dioxide gas can also power things like a gun's action it's possible to have realistic things such as blowback slides. That makes it possible to have a realistic German Luger whose hinged top strap blows up and back realistically.

Full Auto

It's also possible to make airguns that fire fully automatic, like machine guns. The Thompson submachine gun is a popular example.



The Thompson submachine gun or Tommygun is just one example of what CO2 can do.

Crosman

Crosman was one of the first companies to use CO2 to power replica airguns. Their 38C and 38T revolvers were at one time sought after for their realism. Today's CO2 revolvers like the Smith & Wesson M29 are even more realistic, to the point that shooters are advised to not display them openly in public.



Are they really **AIR** guns?

Since the guns we are discussing are powered by carbon dioxide some people think they shouldn't be called airguns. They're right because air doesn't power them. But they fit into the airgun category because they shoot the same ammunition, which is pellets and/or BBs. I could call them gas guns, but that could confuse them with airsoft guns that use Green Gas. So, airguns is the category I will keep them in.

Inexpensive PCPs

CO2 guns have long been considered inexpensive entrees into the world of PCPs. They don't require any support equipment like compressors or air tanks, and they cost far less to begin with. Umarex realized this and now sells the Komplete that uses either a large disposable CO2 tank or a disposable Nitrogen tank that gives power similar to high-pressure air. CO2 has always lagged behind high-pressure air when it comes to power, but the use of Nitrogen cylinders in the Komplete raises the power to that of a PCP-with no additional support equipment needed!

Summer **Guns**

Airguns powered by CO2 have always been thought of as summer guns because they lose power when the weather gets cold. Many shooters don't care about this because they live in warmer climates or they shoot their guns indoors, but not everybody can do this.

Bottom Line


The three powerplant of the airgun world are pneumatic, spring-piston and CO2. Each has a unique set of attributes to offer the community.

SCOPE MOUNT BASES

In this brief article I'll address the other part of a scope ring—the base that connects the ring to the gun the scope will be mounted on.

When I was a boy in the 1950s airguns didn't use scopes, period. Back then many firearms didn't have scopes, either. But as the years passed the scope became—first a better way to see a target and then an almost essential part of any rifle and even many handguns.

Airgun Scopes

Airgun scopes came to popularity in the decade of the 1970s. And, not a lot of thought was given to them in the beginning. The airguns of that time were powered by spring-pistons or CO2. High-pressure air was not in the picture for modern air rifles until 1980.

Air Rifle Scope Bases

At the time many air rifles had dovetail grooves machined into their spring tubes to hold peep sights. Those dovetails became the place where scope rings were attached. Those grooves were nominally 11mm apart, though when the late Dan Bechtel of B-Square and I measured a representative sample of rifles in the 1990s we found groove separations ranging from 9.5mm to almost 14mm. In those days the problem with scope rings was getting a set that attached to a particular rifle. We knew that Czechoslovakian springers had grooves with the narrowest separations and BSA rifles had the widest.

While this was transpiring with airguns, over in the world of firearms people were simply drilling holes in the receivers of rifles and tapping them with threads so scope mounts could be attached.

That could not be done with air rifles though, because their spring tubes were also the compression chambers. Any hole would defeat that purpose.

Weaver Rail

In an attempt to standardize scope bases for firearm rifles the firm of Sako developed a scope mount base that for many years was standard on their rifles. But the rest of the firearms world didn't use it.

Then Weaver came out with their base that was a better standard.

More firearms manufacturers used the Weaver base on their products but there was still a problem. While the Weaver base was a standard of sorts, the distance between the cross-slots on the base was not part of the standard.

A Better Way

In the early 1980s the U.S. Army, seeking a standardized means of attaching sights to the M16 rifle, developed what is now called the Picatinny rail, so-named after the Picatinny Arsenal that handles small arms for the army. Any scope ring manufacturer can obtain the dimensions from the Mil Std. and manufacture the bases of their rings to fit.

A good dealer will know what scope mounts attach to the airguns they sell. So if you can't pick your mounts personally, at least pick your dealer.





TENPOINT CROSSBOWS: WHAT IS THE ATTRACTION?

You've heard the comment, "Pretty doesn't get it done!" What does that mean? It means just because it looks good or pretty doesn't mean it's going to perform.

PRETTY DOESN'T GET IT DONE

Take a hunting dog for instance, when someone is trying to convince you that you need this dog to retrieve your birds and they say she's purdy! Just because she's purdy doesn't mean she's going to retrieve. You want to see how she performs. Ask for an in person experience or if they have hard evidence by means of paperwork, photos, and/or videos.

How does that transfer to crossbows? When you're shopping for crossbows do you look for the prettiest one, slap it in your cart and check out? If so, I'm guessing it's just going to be a wall ornament or you're buying it for someone else and have no idea what you're doing? Am I right?

FOCUS, FOCUS, FOCUS!

Focus on the descriptions and specifications! You'll find out the more important information about the crossbow that will help you narrow down your choices. Let's take a look at the TenPoint Turbo X Crossbow. With two different color options: Vektra Camo or Moss Green both great options but, that is still the appearance not the performance.

If you were to read up about this one you would find that the total weight is 6.8 lbs and from axle to axle while uncocked is 13 inches but cocked is 9.5 inches. Why is that important? Maybe your blind has a window that measures twelve inches. Your limbs smack the edges of your window at the squeezing of the trigger scaring the raisins out of you and the game. You must know the fit of your equipment!

COMFORT IS KEY

The comfort is massively important, it's lightweight at less than seven pounds, ambidextrous, meaning good for either hand. The max draw weight is 230 lbs but it comes with the ACUslide crank cocking and decocking system which only takes five pounds of force to use, that's comforting!

This crossbow offers velocity, energy, ease of use and comfort but you wouldn't know that if you just looked at the picture and said oh, that's purdy let's get it! Unless it's only going to be a decoration, and this goes for everything, EVERYTHING, in life, get past the pretty part and find out about it in more detail and then you'll have an idea of how it performs!







IS .25 THE WAY TO GO?

The four smallbore airgun calibers are .177, .20, .22 and .25. While .177 remains the most popular caliber worldwide, there has been a silent movement of interest in the larger calibers over the years. Today .25 caliber is enjoying a renaissance like never before. But why is that and should you care?

Hunting

One reason for the interest has come about because of hunting. Airguns do not have that much power. Yes, they have grown much more powerful over the last few years, but even so they are still not that powerful. However, when they are used correctly, they can get the job done. Of the four smallbore calibers the .25 has always been the biggest but until recently it suffered from a lack of velocity. The lower velocity meant a rainbow trajectory that hunters did not want to deal with. They wanted a flatter-shooting projectile that didn't require knowing the precise range to the target in order to connect. So the .22 that was lighter and faster was the dominant caliber.

It took about a full decade before airgun hunters recognized that the .25 was now the airgun caliber to choose. Airguns from companies like AirForce Airguns were pushing .22-caliber pellets so fast they were rivalling the venerated .22 long rifle firearm cartridge. Muzzle energies of 105 foot-pounds and more were coming from the .22-caliber Escape-series AirForce rifles and the selection of pellets was much broader in that caliber than in the quarter-inch bore.

I attribute it to the introduction of larger pellet calibers like .30, .35 and even larger. The .25 is no longer the most expensive game in town and shooters seem more willing to choose it over .22 for the higher muzzle energy it offers.

The ammunition shortages of 2014 drove many firearm shooters into the airgun ranks. They were used to paying 25-40 cents a round for ammunition, so all pellet prices seem cheap.

Long Range

Finally, what might be the biggest driver of renewed interest in .25 caliber is the current fascination with benchrest shooting at longer distances. The .25 caliber pellet bucks the wind better than a .22 and you only have to shoot one time at 100 yards to discover this. Yes, .30 caliber does even better at longer ranges, but the pellets cost significantly more and the .25 has proven itself in matches. In fact, the .257-caliber slug that is a recent spinoff of the .25-caliber pellet may soon prove to be superior to the .30.

What I'm seeing today is a push in the .25-caliber arena to develop airgun projectiles that have never before been seen. And air rifles like many of those from FX and the Air Venturi AvengeX that allow for interchangeable barrels are tailor-made to be platforms for new .25-caliber and .257-caliber projectiles that haven't yet left the drawing board. These adaptable rifles are low-risk platforms for the enterprising airgunner.
